A child at the age of eight is busy with his mental growth and begins to find his worth. After our first phase of formative development which focused more on administrative procedures, management and organization, in our eighth year, we began to craft and instill our spirit and culture under shared objectives. It is also a time when we look beyond the school walls and set full swing to contact and exchange with the outside world.

Exuberance in School Life

In 2007–08, we took big steps forward to maximize students' exposure in interschool and even in international activities. The School was blessed with success in winning numerous trophies and prizes. Our students displayed tremendous interest in events of academic, cultural and kinaesthetic nature. Besides our teachers and teaching assistants, a total of 32 external tutors and coaches were contracted to run small groups that catered for the diversified interest and talents of the students. Training and competitions on essay writing and comic drawing with strong social context were on our schedules. Reading and Chinese calligraphy competitions were well received. The result of Hong Kong Jing Ying Cup Economics Study Program competition was well achieved. An excellent project with presentation on Environment and Health has brought the School a Championship in the Liberal Studies Pilot Program Competition. Our Secondary Three students took pride in beating rivals including senior students from prestigious schools. We also had many students participating actively in the 59th Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival.

Apart from academic and cultural programs, our students have also been very active in sports and athletics. Achievements in Table Tennis and in Cross-country open competitions have brought our students the Outstanding Athlete Awards in the 2007–08 Bauhinia Bowl Award. I believe the School has fostered in students an infectious zest for participations to make school lives rich and purposeful. I hope this remains with them for their whole lives.

Academic Achievement

In public examinations, we continued to make sustainable progress. In the Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination 2008, our students managed to attain a

pass rate of 83.7%. For the three core subjects, English, Chinese and Mathematics, which all students had to take, the average A–C rate was 46.1%. In the Advanced Level Examination, the overall pass rate was 86.9% and the rate of A–C grades was 22.8%. Here I wish to congratulate all our graduates on passing the English Language or the Use of English examinations; failing these examinations can become a barrier to further studies for many students in Hong Kong.

Curriculum Design

Apart from crafting more effective school routines, our staff has been spending hundreds of hours or more in seminars and workshops preparing for the New Senior Secondary reform. New designs and pilot schemes in the junior curriculum, Science and Integrated Humanities in particular, were reviewed and improved. We do not boast by saying that the teaching plans were brewed out of scratch. Painstaking investigations were made in search of good materials and references. Planning in teacher deployment for Liberal Studies to be implemented at senior level in 2009 has already been underway. Assiduous efforts have been put forth by the first wave of teachers assigned to the subject. Subjects to be offered in 2009–10 have also been formulated. Our middle management personnel have also been working hard to put the School in full gear on the coming big changeover.

Gifted Education Programmes

In line with today's egalitarian social climate that calls for more attention to the underachievers, we compile our own programmes for students with special needs. At the same time, by offering better opportunities and resources, we strive to promote quality education for the gifted. Our school-based Enrichment Course for Secondary One and Two continued to solicit collective efforts from teachers. To realize the potentials of the academically talented, we provide in-house enhancement courses. We are also one of the few schools that successfully nominate talented students to benefit from the Support Measures for the Exceptionally Gifted offered by the Education Bureau and The Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education. These selected students, excelling in areas of leadership, science, mathematics and humanities, take courses run by tertiary institutions, often attached with credit points for purpose of future admission to the universities. Besides, Chan Nai San of Secondary Two, having secured the fourth place in the 29th World Amateur Go Championship and many other awards, has successfully secured in a place in the Young Achievers' Gallery. This YAG is set up by the EDB to celebrate brilliant achievements of talented students in Hong Kong.

We have been striving to ensure that the motivated and the talented are never deprived. The School also establishes Awards for the Exceptionally Gifted Student in Multiple Intelligence with which they can pay off the fees for hiring personal coaches.

Fifteen students demonstrating their talents in interschool or international performance were offered the awards.

Catering for Diversity

Starting from last school year, the School has been accumulating efforts to look after students with special needs at both ends. Miss Mandy Chan, our education psychologist has been recruited to give professional support to the gifted and the deprived. More accurate assessments are made to pinpoint specific areas of strengths or weaknesses so that more effective enhancement or remedy could be provided. For those handicapped students preparing for public examinations, our expert even called upon the Hong Kong Examinations and Assessment Authority to provide them special examination arrangements in compliance with the stipulations of the Equal Opportunities Commission. More teaching assistants were employed to help with extra tuitions in core subjects to students who were academically weak or absent from schools for training or competitions.

Brought Closer to our Motherland

I believe most would agree that 2008 is a very special year for our China. The Sichuan earthquake and the Olympic Games together with a few minor issues brought grief and pride to our country and ignited flames in our hearts. In times of adversity or triumph, never has the sense of national identity been felt so strongly in the school campus. The tragedy in Sichuan has called upon the staff, students and parents to show concern and extend their support. Before making a donation of more than \$360,000 to victims of the catastrophe, we ran talks, charity concerts and photo-taking so as to let students understand the background of the tragedy and the purpose of the fund-raising more thoroughly.

Hosting the Olympic Games has been a dream of our Chinese people for decades. We took the occasion of our Annual Open Day to work out a thematic exhibition to introduce the more significant role our fellow countrymen played in the Olympic Games, dating back to the first participation in the 1930s. Students also wrote a lot of slogans and couplets to promote the Olympic Spirit in our school for a positive culture.

Additional Tools

To enhance the effectiveness of teaching and learning, our school has been spending much time and effort in installing the High-Definition Campus TV. Topping up from the \$200,000 subsidy from the Quality Education Fund for a conventional system, the cost of the state-of-the-art technology affordable in a school runs into more than a million dollars. Our objective is to build an information platform where we can bring the outside world into the school campus and facilitate internal communication. After the present

stage of testing, we will broadcast news, performance and works of students. Apart from elevating the presentation skills, we also strive to train students in hands-on production of creative media.

Way Forward

In recent years, we have been taking *Moral and Civic Education*, *Reading to Learn*, *Project Learning* and *Information Technology for Interactive Learning* as the four Key Tasks in our junior secondary education. In 2007–08 we took steps towards fulfilling these tasks. While we take academic results seriously, we do not follow the traditional strategy of trading off all non-examination-oriented activities in exchange of high examination results in a short time. To attain the latter goal, we would have to limit the freedom of choice in subject streams, trim cultural appreciation programs, cut athletic practices to make way for tutorials and tests. We are not prepared to use the past wisdom to impose restrictions on the present students in order to forge a future brand name. Following the law of diminishing returns, we would rather tolerate a higher fail rate than pay a huge sacrifice for making up for the minor shortfall.

Due tribute should be paid to the teachers whose unremitting effort and efficiency have helped to build up, for the School, a good learning culture and an academic progress that outpaces precedents. I am most appreciative of their loyalty, devotion, toil and sweat as well as willingness to face challenges and to grasp the opportunities brought forth by the changing education landscape. My gratitude also goes to the parents, especially the PTA Committee and the volunteers helping in school functions. Their confidence and concern have grown to become driving forces for the School. Our major stakeholders, the students, are picking up the good manners and learning habits, and I believe more and more of our teachers would like to spend their lives giving time, skills and efforts to worthwhile endeavours where they could make a difference. Surely the roads to success are still thorny and meandering. However, if something appears to be too easy, we are probably doing it the wrong way. My heartfelt appreciation must also be given to our Deputy Principal, Mr. Au Kwong Wing, who has spent endless hours in lifting the School off the ground. For these couple of years since the Comprehensive Review in 2006, Mr. Au has been working hard to groom our staff of middle management into strong, independent but coherent work groups. As the founding Principal of the School, may I take pride in the description of our school: “Time and people may change but values and culture don’t.” I would also like to express my appreciation for the conscientious work rendered by the non-teaching staff, who have provided essential backup services for the School.
