- encourage parental and community participation and help them take pride and partner in the development of the School.

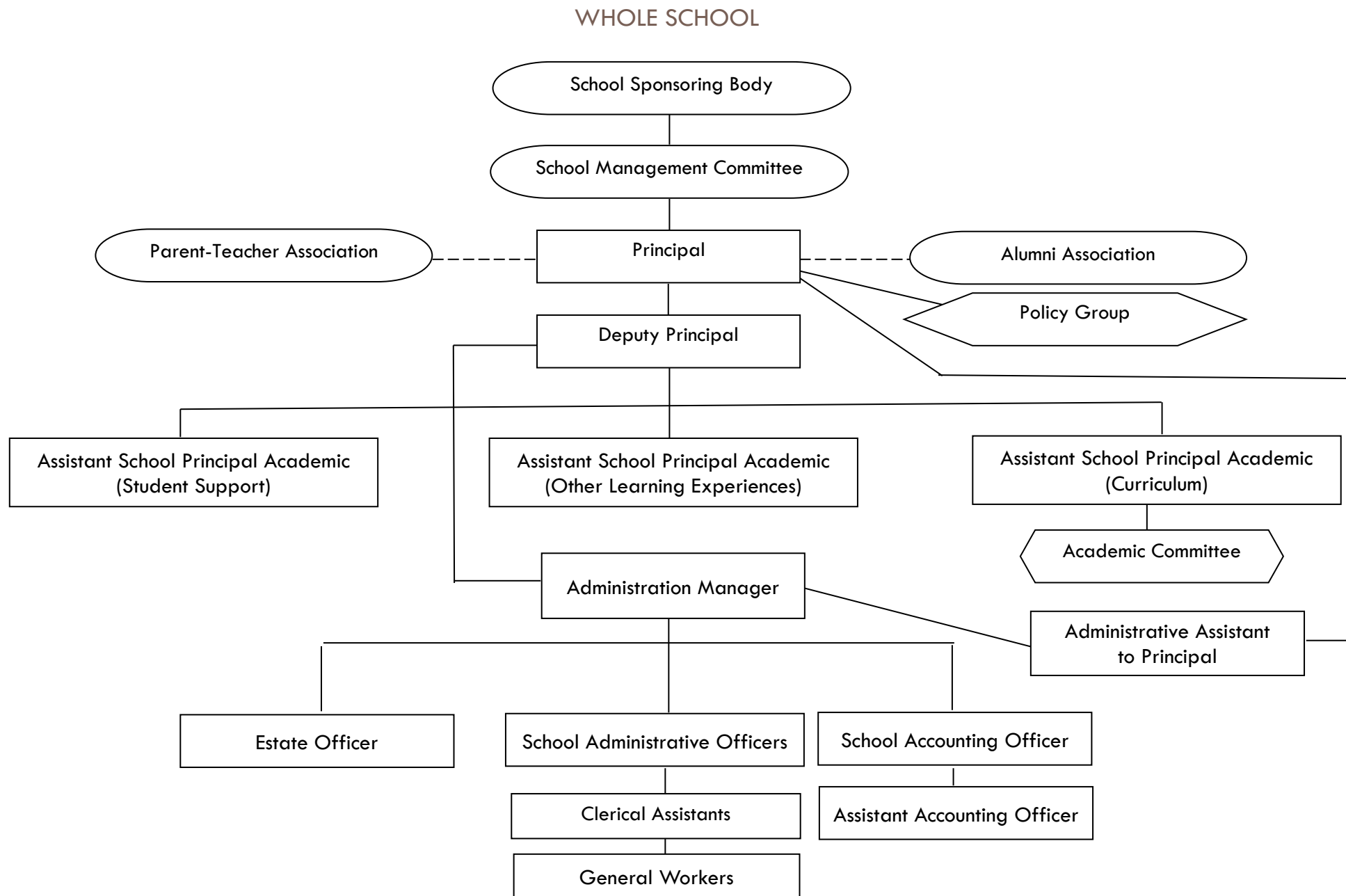
CFSS School Profile

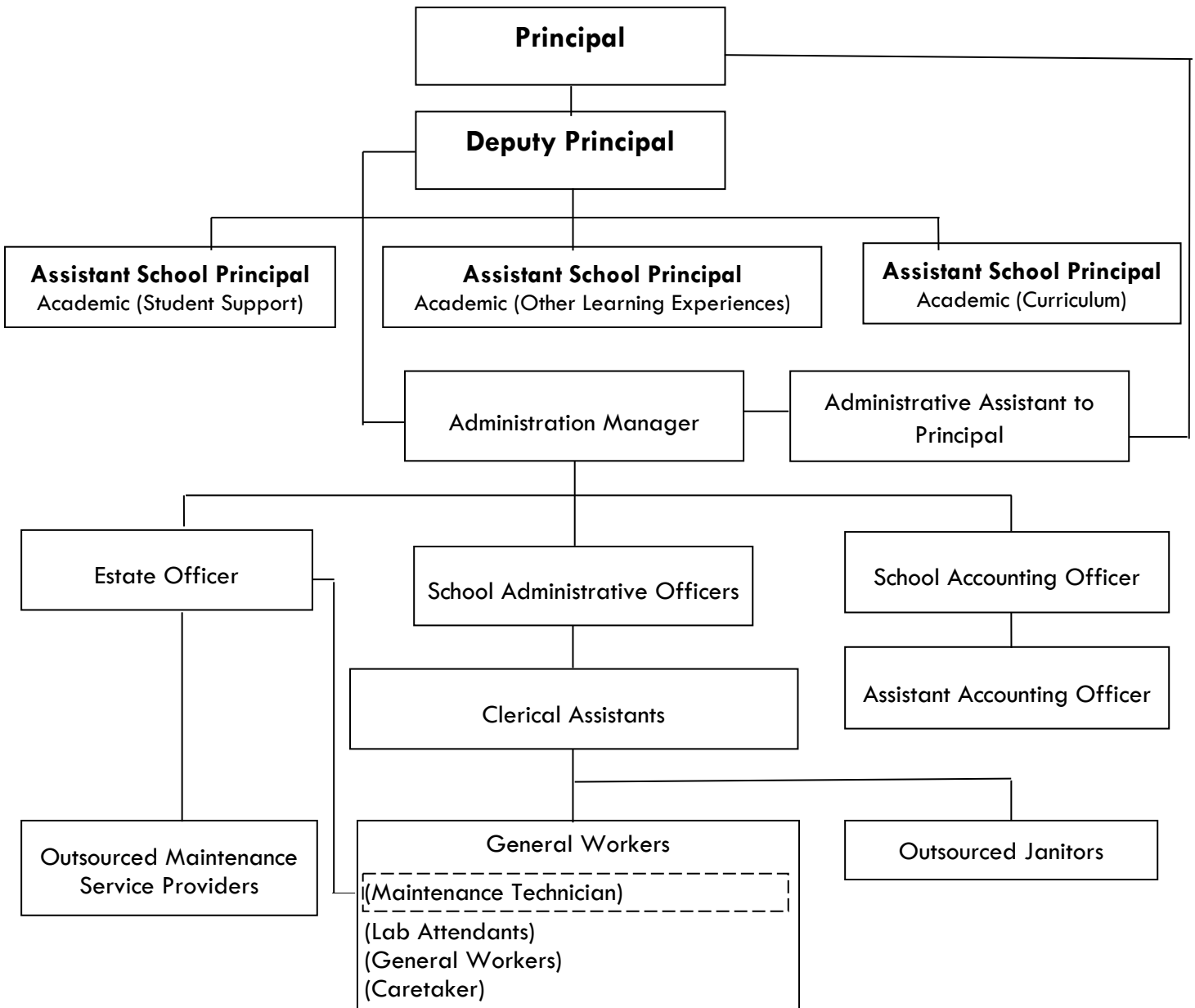

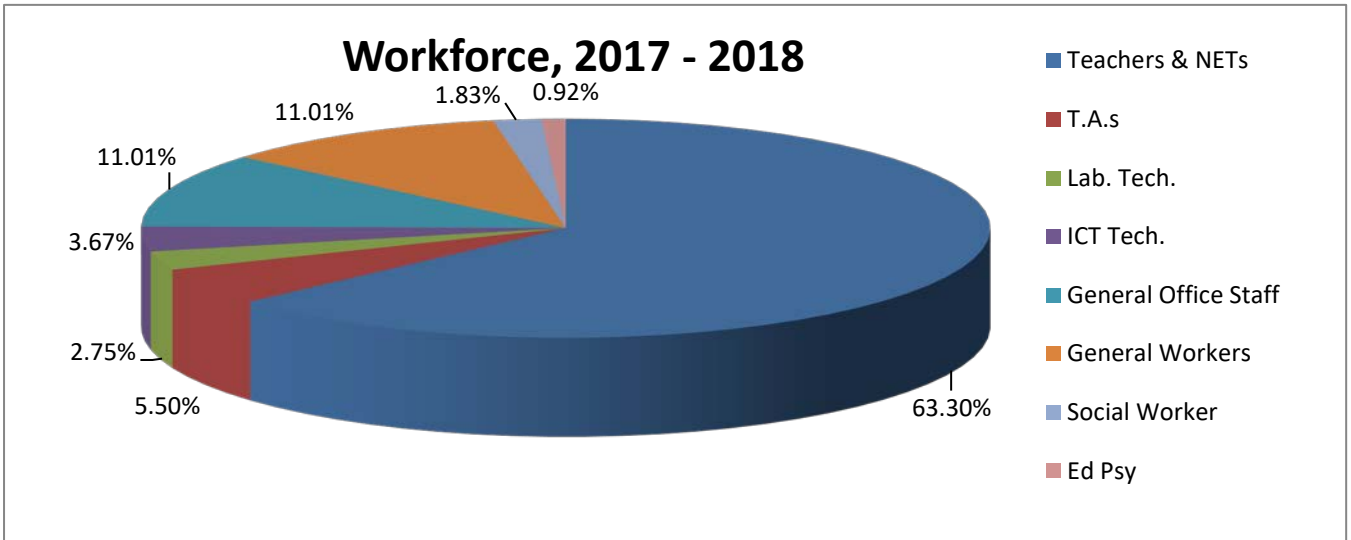

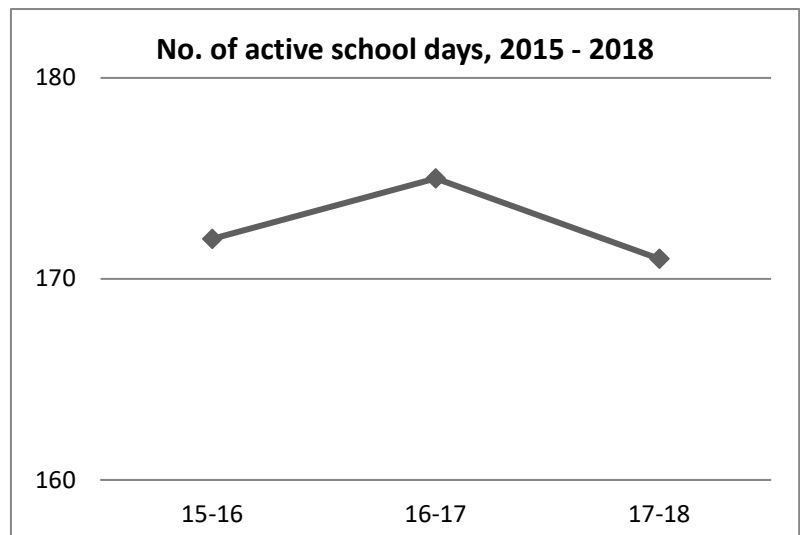

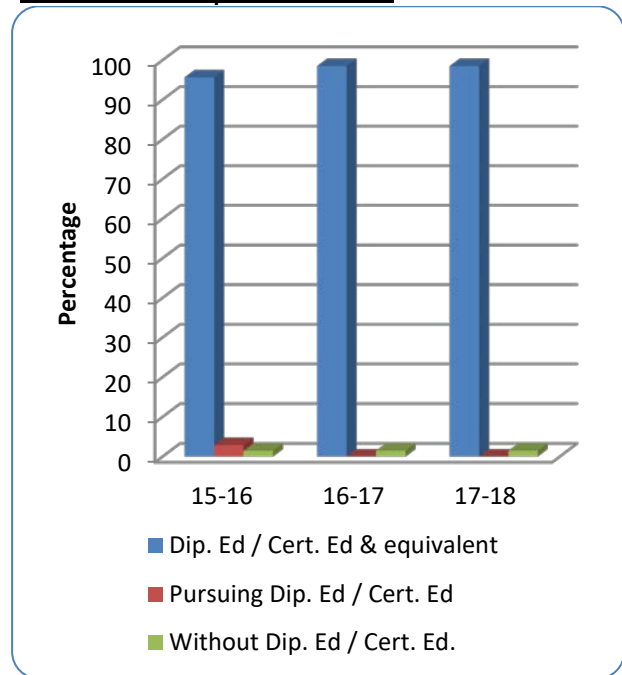
Highest academic qualifications

Professional qualifications



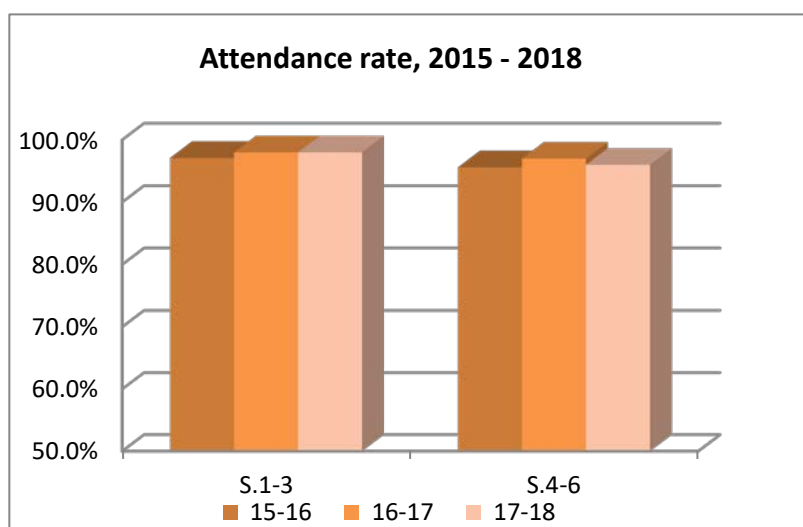

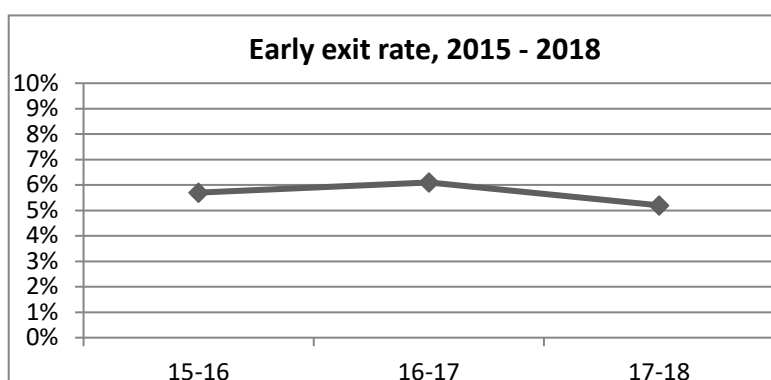

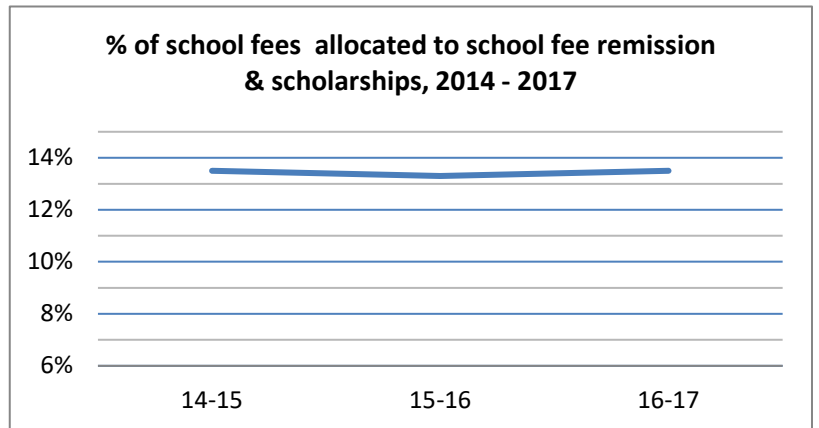

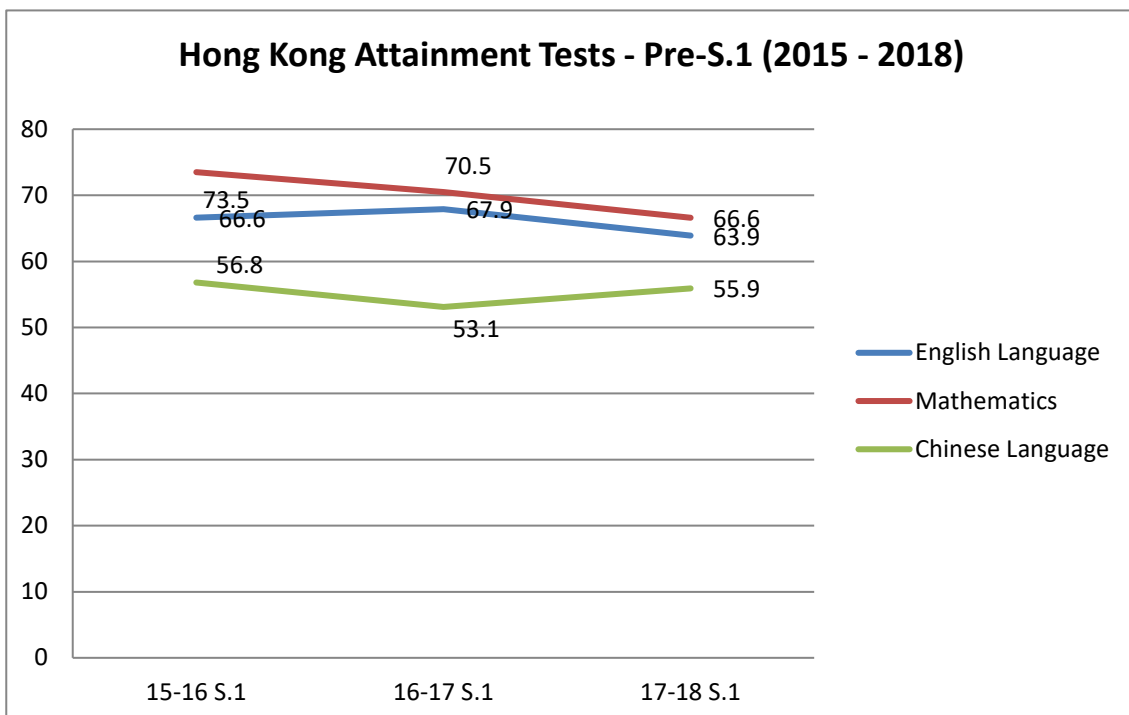

The table below shows the scores obtained by new S.1 intakes in HKAT before the academic year starts.

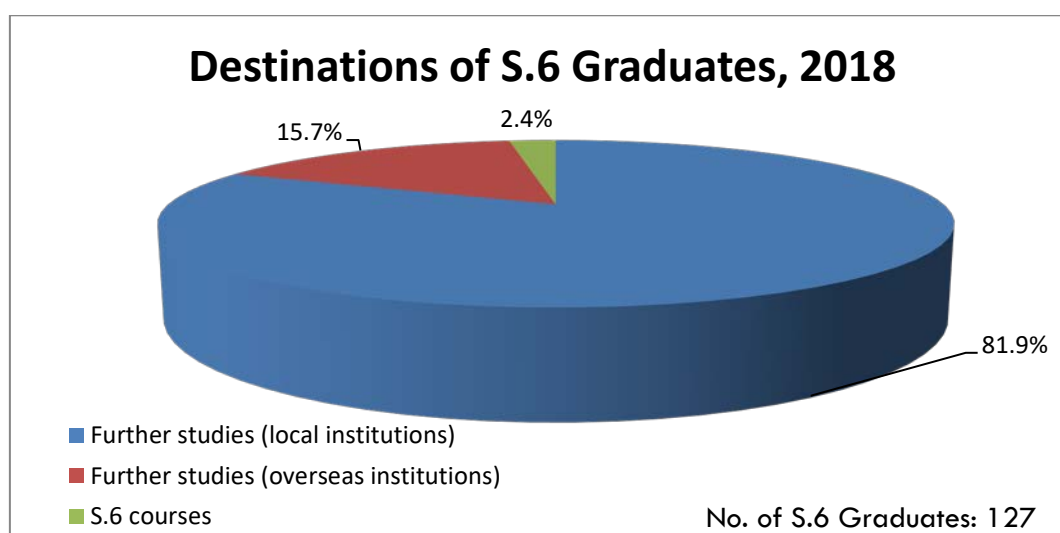

Destinations of 2018 S.6 Graduates

For JUPAS, 123 students sat HKDSE Examination. 109 (88.6%) were given JUPAS offers and 91 (74.0%) were in degree courses. It is encouraging to see that 97.6% of our students are able to continue their studies in tertiary institutes.

Major Concerns – Achievements and Reflections

1. To enhance students' capacity for self-directed learning (SDL)

Achievements

- The good practice of lesson preview has been sustained. Students were often briefed in advance so that they might look up relevant vocabulary, acquired general ideas and concepts, and finish lesson preview worksheets before lessons. For example, they searched information about the national flag or emblem before they studied the internal and foreign affairs of modern China. They acquired situational vocabulary such as “poverty”, “sub-divided flats” and “hikikomori”. This practice was especially helpful for writing and reading. Students also made better use internet research online and other print media in the library as a lesson preview. Junior-form students completed lesson preview work more eagerly than senior-form students. They were also encouraged (to spend about 30 minutes) to revise what they had learnt after each lesson. Before the start of each topic, at least 40% of students were able to share some relevant common sense, recent news and other information in class.
- Different academic departments expanded the CFSS Knowledge Base (CFSS KB) by uploading more useful materials. More e-learning tools were introduced and widely used for SDL. CFSS KB was enriched with 119 new posts last year, leading to 310 posts in total. Most academic departments were able to motivate students to make use of CFSS KB for SDL. Last year, students visited the CFSS KB 12267 times. Each student used the KB 12.8 times on average. Other e-learning tools were introduced and used by teachers of other subjects, not just in Information & Communication Technology. The most common ones were Google Classroom, Mirroring, Edpuzzle, Socrative, Kahoot, Geogebra, Nearpod, Flower Power, Edmodo, QR scan and I-learner. Besides, a few departments have uploaded videos to social platforms to provide solutions or explanations. Students found it much more convenient and accessible especially outside school hours. Online question banks were installed and made accessible to both teachers for lesson preparation and students for self-study.
- In general, students were able to produce quality projects in Project-based Learning (PBL). This was especially conspicuous in the PBL-II module of the Enrichment Course (EC). On the whole, students' comments on their application of the skills learnt throughout the project (of which SDL is a part) was positive. About 78.4% of them felt they were able to apply 5W2H skills in the brainstorming stage; many of them said they were able to apply concept mapping in narrowing the research topic (87.1%) as well as in data analysis (86.5%). Most of them (91.2%) thought that they were able to apply problem-solving skills better. About 88.8% of students thought the information gathering skills learnt in PBL were useful for their future project work. The results were positive. Many of them (89.5%) agreed that the report writing skills learnt in PBL-II were useful for their future project work. Over 80% of students found the project planning skills as well as data organizing and analyzing skills useful (83.0% and 87.1% for the respective cases).

Students were positive about the content (92.3%), material (84.6%) and organization (83.3%) of the module. They were also confident in applying the skills they had learnt (82.7%). This might be due to their exposure to the PBL-I module.

The overall performance of students was satisfactory this year, with an average score of 68.4. The passing rate was 98.9 %, with 10.8% attaining excellence.

- Greater degree of autonomy in learning to arouse students' interest
Students were asked to collect information on areas they were interested in. For example, students were asked to collect information about a career of their choice and conduct an interview with a person belonging to that industry. S.6 students gave a presentation on an English programme of their own choice as well as being introduced to useful English vocabulary in the programme. S.4 students were asked to do self-directed projects about Cheung Chau. They presented their findings in the form of models, photo albums or videos. S.5 students were asked to do self-directed projects about rock specimens in the Geology & Climate Change Resource Centre (GCCRC). All the information was then uploaded to the relevant QR codes.
- A professional sharing culture has been developed among our staff. In addition, other schools have also visited our school for academic sharing.

Reflections

- A more proactive learning attitude with learner autonomy and learner independence will be developed among students, elevating the atmosphere of self-directed learning to student-centred learning.
- To cater for the diversity of learning abilities, the teachers' role as a facilitator should be strengthened. Teachers will adopt more student-centred teaching pedagogies.
- The school will continue to cultivate an environment that fosters student-centred learning, e.g., installing more self-learning devices and software.

2. To instil career and life planning skills among students

Achievements

- Different departments and teams have integrated career and life planning concepts into their curricula and activities. They adopted different channels such as:
 - Career visits**, e.g., 5 Geography students visited “Be an Urban Planner” in August 2018 organized by City Gallery Summer Planning School 2018.
 - Career planning in curricula**, e.g., The issue of youth employment was discussed in S.5 Liberal Studies under the module Personal Growth and Inter-personal Relationships. About 90% of S.5 students could reflect on the challenges and opportunities that would be faced when pursuing their future career.

Job finding, e.g., writing job application letters; analysing recruitment advertisements (S.3 English); conducting interviews with a person belonging to an industry of their choice. Students focused on the importance of the use of English (S.5 English).

- To strengthen students' sense of career planning and management, a total of 25 Personal & Social Education (PSE) lessons were designed and conducted by Career Team and Class teachers. Regular evaluations by teachers and students were conducted to collect their opinions and make improvements to the PSE lesson design for the following academic year.

- Career-related personality tests, CII and BIM were conducted to S.4 and S.5 student from Sep to Dec, 2017. A total of 311 students participated in this survey. The results from these surveys were kept as a reference for further CLP activity planning.

- A CFSS alumni sharing session and a 4th Career Expo were held on 16 May and 28 Jun 2018 respectively. In total 9 alumni joined, and a total of 469 and 307 students participated in each respective event.
For the 4th Career Expo, a total of 16 parallel sessions, from the fields of health-care, financial, business, engineering, civil service and performing arts were provided for students to choose from.
In cooperation with the Student Council, a subject streaming consultation was held on 27 Jun 2018 to S.3 students. Total 158 S.3 students participated in this event.
- 1910 participations, a record-high, were recorded this year and students from S.1 to S.6 actively participated in various CLP-related activities organized by the external organization. The breakdown of the data is as follows:

Reflections

- A larger variety of career-related activities is recommended to enable students to acquire the necessary lifelong skills and attitudes (workplace ethics, integrity, responsibility and respect).
- More career-counselling should be provided to enable students to choose their future career paths according to their interests, aptitudes and aspirations.
- Career & life planning will be regularized into the implementation of different departments and teams.
- The successful CLP programme (i.e. training from junior forms onwards) provides a blueprint to the team's future plans.

3. To enhance students' reading ability through Extensive Reading

Achievements

- The Language Enhancement Team cooperated actively with the Grace Wu Library to promote reading. A “CFSS Extensive Reading Week” and “CFSS Extensive Reading Fest.” were held in Nov 2017 and Apr 2018 respectively. The two functions included activities ranging from guest talks to students and parents, thematic book exhibitions, and book fairs for students to audio book competitions among students. We Participated in 香港電台有聲好書比賽參賽書目展 between Sept and Oct 2017, an Audio Book Competition held by RTHK which took place on 13 Oct 2018, and a Book Fair was held on 23 – 24 Apr 2018 in the covered playground.
- To enhance the reading atmosphere in the school campus the school continued with the organization of “World Reading Day” activities, display boards and related promotions. A “World Book Day Book Fair” was held on 23 -24 Apr 2018 in the covered playground. In this way, subject teachers were also invited to lead students to visit book fairs during subject lessons.
 - To stimulate the interest of students in extensive reading a monthly book display of various subjects was held throughout the school year. A total of 8 thematic book exhibitions were held during the school year 2017-2018:
 - 1 Throughout the year: Highlights of Dr Wu's collection - Around the world with CFSS
 - 2 Throughout the year: 孫中山與近代中國
 - 3 1 Sep - 31 Oct 2017: 香港電台"有聲好書 2018" 比賽參賽書目展
 - 4 1 Sep - 31 Oct 2017: Our Hong Kong Story
 - 5 1 Nov - 31 Dec 2017: 興趣、夢想與生涯探索
 - 6 1 Jan - 28 Feb 2018: 第 29 屆好書龍虎榜候選書展
 - 7 1 Mar - 30 Apr 2018: STREAM book exhibition
 - 8 1 May - 30 Jun 2018: All About Soccer
 - 586 quality traditional paperback books were bought that related to current curriculums or the most recent editions of books students like to read in their leisure.
 - Quality free issue magazines for example, “Courseday”, “青年空間” and “蒲公英” etc. are provided by the school library for students without cost.
 - New books were continuously displayed in the “New Addition” corner in the library and regularly throughout the whole 2017-2018 school year.
 - Information and book lists about current thematic book exhibitions were sent by email to students and also put on the school’s cloud knowledge base on the school library webpage for students’ easy access and reference.

Reflections

- We will increase the use of other channels like, Morning assemblies, Reading Periods and school websites as ways to promote reading related activities.
- With the Education Bureau's Promotion of Reading Grant, we will increase the quantity of the books about different subjects to promote extensive reading.

Support for Student Development

1. New S.1 Students to CFSS

Each year, a new cohort of 175 S.1 students enters CFSS. To help them to adapt to the new school environment, a two-week Bridging Course (last year's being from 6 to 17 August 2018) is held. This Course, lasting for two weeks, is characteristically composed of 2 sessions every day. The first session is academically-oriented (English Language training) to enable the new S.1 students to adapt to the secondary school curriculum. The second session is more activity-based. New co-curricular activities related to fencing, archery and social service have been organized. The Orientation Programme for new S.1 students was held on 6 August 2018. The theme of this S.1 programme was "Adapting to New Life in Secondary School". The school social worker, as well as several YMCA members, were invited to train peer counselors to run the function. Over 50 peer counselors joined this programme.

2. Training for student leaders

Each Student Support Team offered training to the students involved regarding their routine and ad hoc duties. The Student Council cabinet members participated in the Joint-School Leadership Training Camp in Wong Siu Sang Leadership Training Centre from the 26 to the 27 July 2018 to enhance their leadership skills. A Personal & Social Education (PSE) Leadership Training Camp was also organized. The Discipline Team ran four training sessions to all prefects (28 Sept, 12 Oct, 16 Oct 2017 and 7 Feb 2018). The Head Prefect and Deputy Head Prefects joined an Outward Bound Training event. In addition, a Prefect Day Camp in Po Leung Kuk Jockey Club Tai Tong Holiday Camp was organized on the 3rd March 2018 and 37 prefects participated. Workshops for peer counsellors have been organized by the Counselling Team. Student Ambassadors received training on an ad hoc basis for large-scale school functions, e.g. S.1 Information Days, Open Day.

3. Other Learning Experiences

Every CFSS student can join at least one education tour organized by the school during their six years of studies, regardless of the financial background of their family. In 2017-18, the following education tours were organized.
