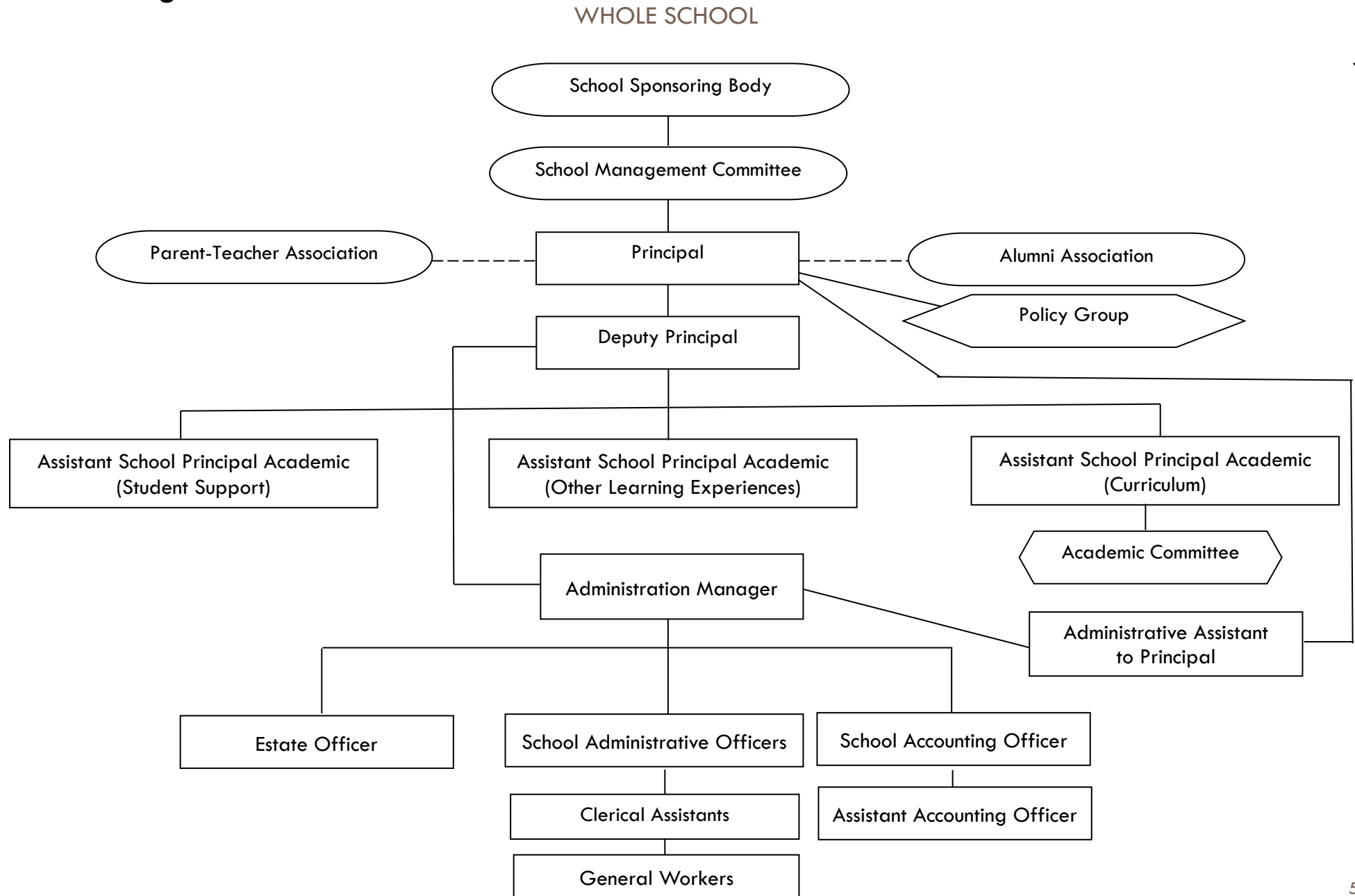

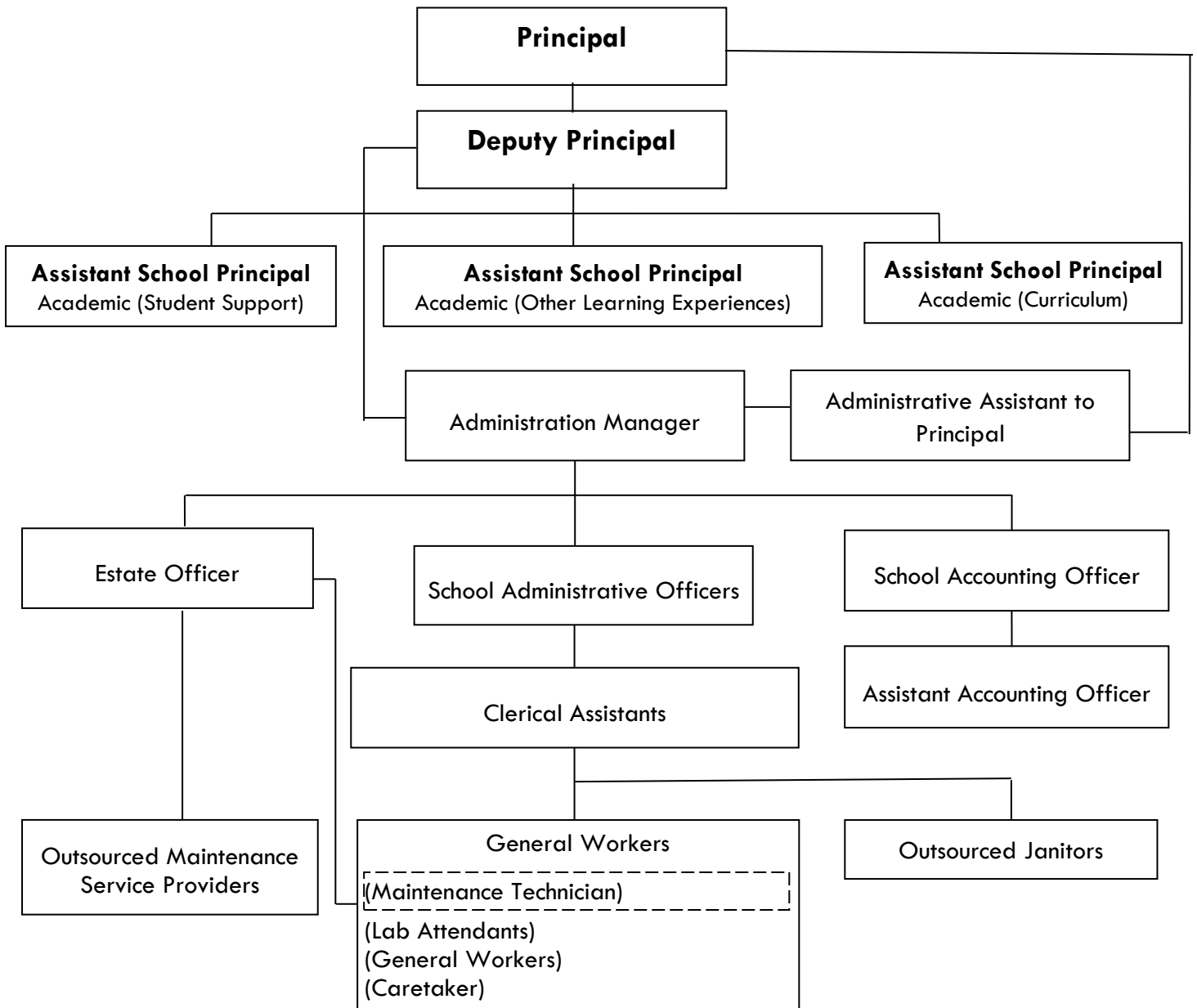

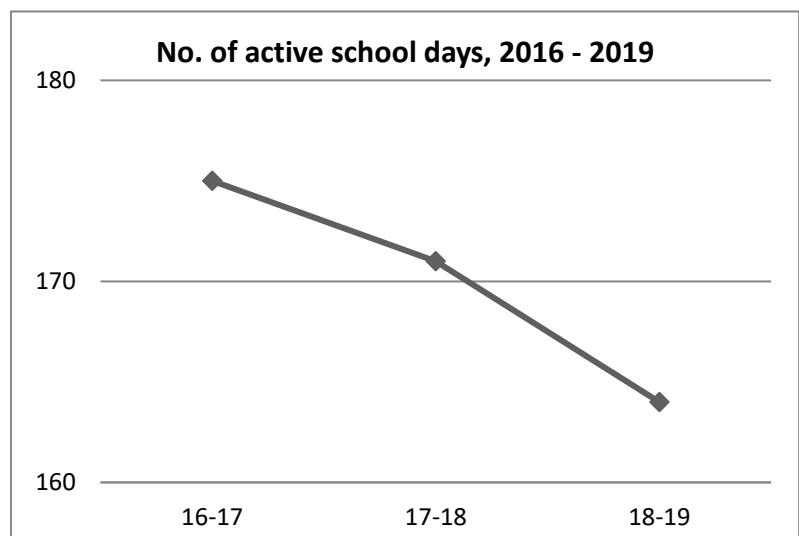

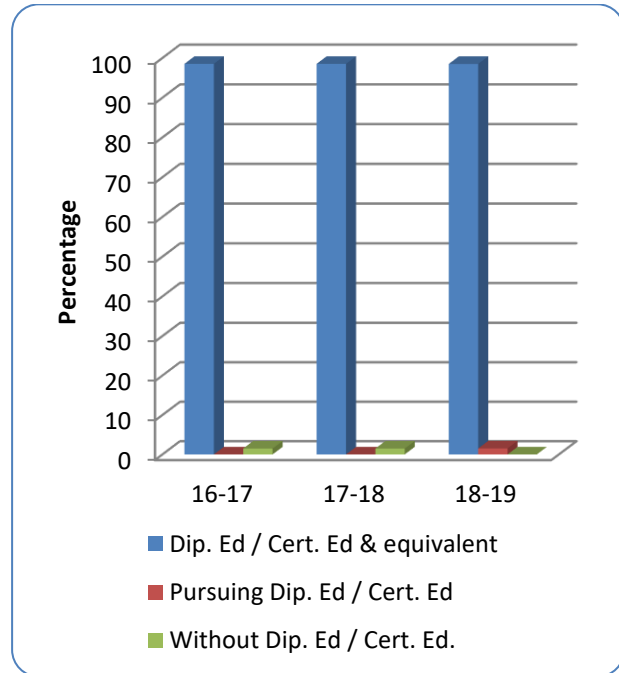
Highest academic qualifications

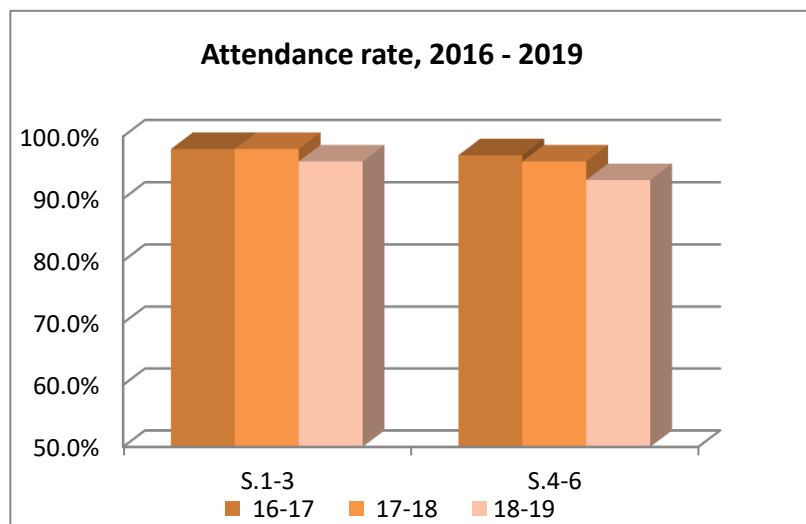

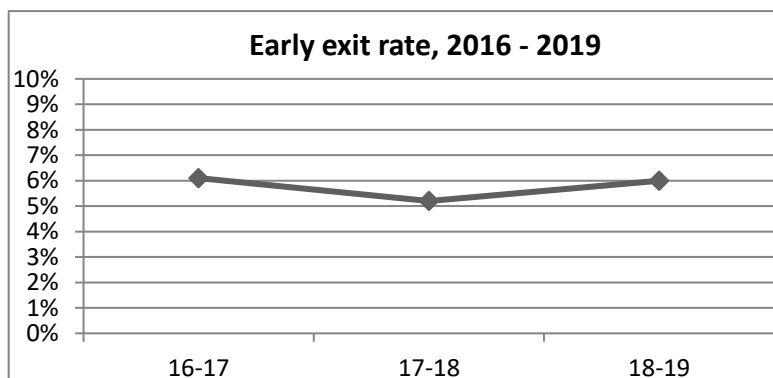

An early exit refers to leaving our school before completing S.6.

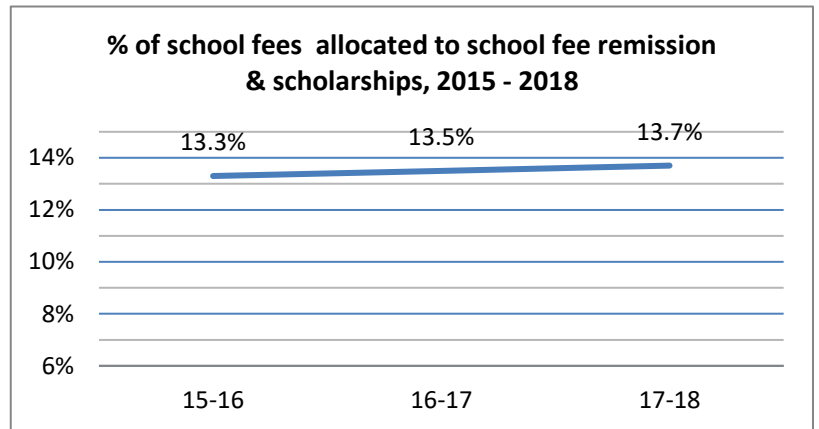

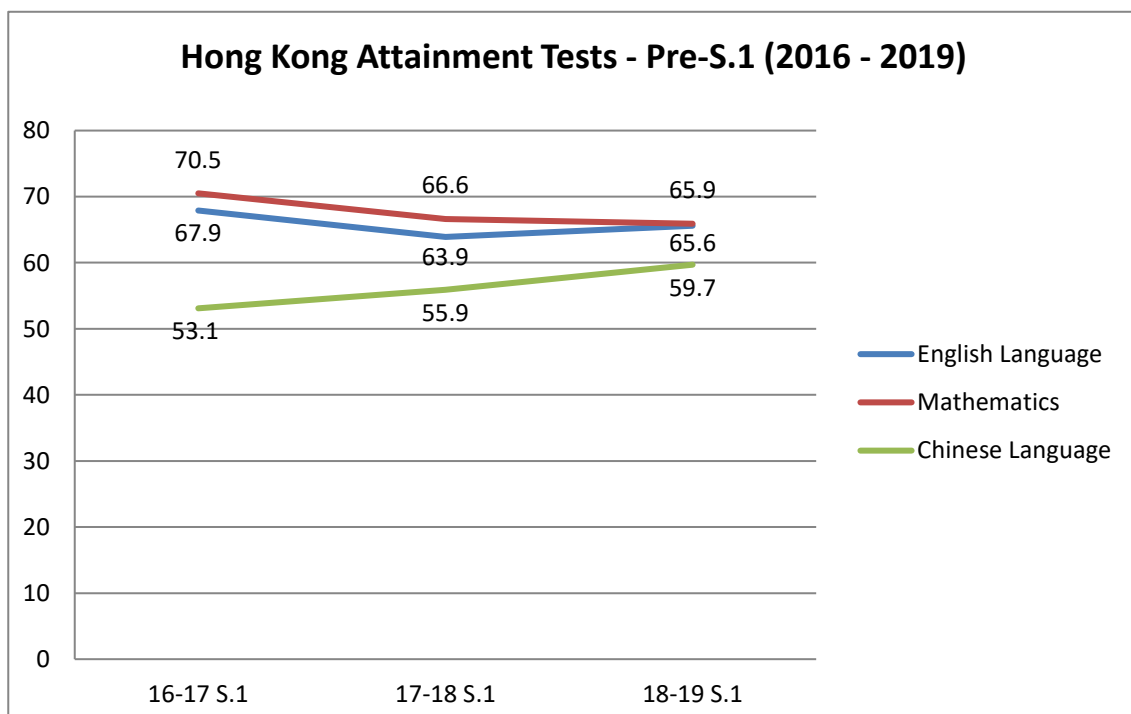

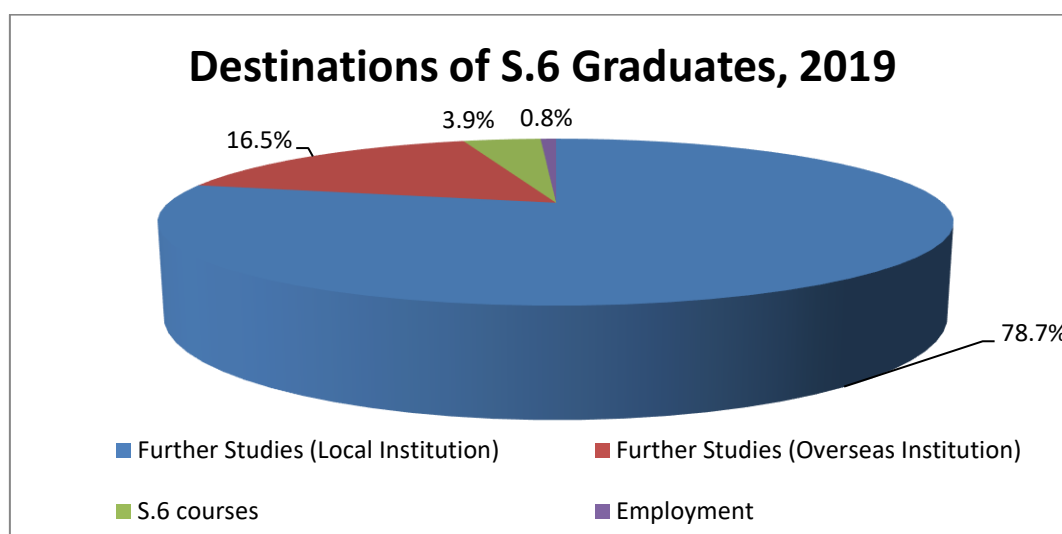
HKDSE (2019)

Destinations of 2019 S.6 Graduates

For JUPAS, 127 students sat for HKDSE Examination. 106 (83.5%) were given JUPAS offers and 82 (64.6%) were in degree courses. It is encouraging to see that 95.2% of our students are able to continue their studies in tertiary institutions.



Major Concerns – Achievements and Reflections

1. Student-centred Learning (SCL)

Achievements

- Student-centred learning culture was successfully implemented into various academic departments.

As per transformation from student-directed learning (SDL) to student-centred learning (SCL) as a learning strategy in the 2018 – 2021 School Development Plan, subject departments further extended, enriched and consolidated the approach, with the aim of fostering an SCL culture in school.

Teachers provided students with guidance and the necessary assistance to facilitate SCL. They assigned pre-lesson preparation and completing pre-lesson worksheets. Some students took the extra step of exploring additional material.

The Flipped Classroom culture was set up with the use of student-centred learning, SCL, platforms. Learning and teaching activities were made more interactive with the use of educational Apps and tools: cultivating collaborative learning, having real-time discussions, collecting experimental data, giving presentations, drawing mind-maps, and mathematic computation, etc.

Various learning activities such as outdoor visits, collaboration projects with external organizations, as well as student-centred learning activities including debate, role play and group discussions were implemented in different subjects to broaden students' horizons.

Discussion groups were set up on educational platforms such as Google Classroom, Google Blogger etc., to provide a real-time exchange of ideas and off-lesson discussion among students and between teachers and students.

Students were encouraged to suggest ways to tackle different issues in in-class discussions and post-lesson writing tasks to develop their creativity and critical thinking.

Online question banks were installed and made accessible to both teachers for lesson preparation and students' for extended learning.

An inductive approach of teaching will be adopted in certain departments (e.g. Geography and Liberal Studies). Data files will be provided to students and they will be asked to come up with the answers via group discussions.

- Academic learning goals on subjects chosen by students were set at the beginning of academic year.

Students' learning progress was assessed and targets were adjusted after each formative assessment. It gave opportunities to students to adjust their learning strategies and strive for continuous improvement.

- In general, students were able to produce quality projects in Project-based Learning (PBL). This was especially conspicuous in the module of PBL-II of the Enrichment Course (EC).

On the whole, students' comments on their application of the skills learnt throughout the project, of which SDL is a part, was positive. About 72.7% of them thought they were able to apply 5W2H skills in the brainstorming stage; many of them (87.2%) said they were able to apply concept mapping to narrow the research topics well and for data analysis. Most of them (89.5%) thought that they were able to apply problem-solving skills.

About 88.4% of students thought the information gathering skills learnt in PBL were useful for their future project work. Many of them (89.5%) agreed that the report writing skills learnt in PBL-II were useful to their future project work. Over 80% of students found the project planning skills as well as data organizing and analyzing skills useful, with the statistics of 84.3% and 87.8% for the respective cases.

Reflections

- Teachers should be encouraged to make good use of the CFSS cloud KB and Google classroom to promote the self-directed learning by the students. Some online assessment could be conducted via these learning platforms.
- The target of implementing the SCL was not fully achieved as students required more time and practice to fully benefit from applying the SCL strategies.
- Students' study skills such as note-taking, critical thinking, effective reading, time management, quality discussion and presentation, etc. should be further sharpened and their collaborative learning skills needed to be developed.

2. Healthy School Life (HSL)

Achievements

- The Healthy School Life Team reiterated the three major areas, namely Physical Health, Mental Health and Social Well-being, to help students develop a good and healthy school life.
- Workshops and talks were arranged to strengthen students in the three areas. Positive feedback was received from teachers and students. Students understood more about the needs of different people. Alertness to their work-life balance was aroused.

- The “Participate in Sports, Stay away from Drugs” Programme and Healthy School Day were successfully held. The programmes included a slogan design competition, photo-taking competition, inter-house rowing competition, PTA Family Fun Day as well as sharing, a book exhibition and talks during the whole year. Students, teachers and parents actively participated in the events.
- Healthy School Ambassadors were recruited. The scheme aims to develop a strong sense of what is a healthy school life among students, to maintain a healthy classroom environment, to develop the sense of “eat green” and “live green” and to build up students’ leadership and organization skills through planning various activities.
- Secret Angels for S.1 students and blessing to S.6 students received positive comment.
- After attending a First Aid class and an AED workshop, a total of 18 teachers obtained valid First Aid and AED certificates.

Reflections

- Food nutrition should be further focused on in the coming year to enlighten students' sense of food as a health issue.
- More propaganda and promotion should be done to increase students' awareness before activities are held.
- More Healthy School Ambassadors should be recruited to encourage them to participate more actively in health courses.
- More workshops on AED for students will be launched to enhance the school safety standard.

3. Global Awareness (GAP)

Achievements

- The Global Awareness Team organized and arranged various talks and exchange programmes from external organizations for both staff and students. Exchange programmes were conducted with students from Shanghai Nanyang High School (our sister school), 2 schools in the Guangdong Province, 2 schools in Malaysia and 1 school in Singapore. Students also attended two special talks related to Economics and the geology industry in China. More than 400 students attended talks on topics related to global awareness. In addition, there were some staff development workshops ranging from Arts and Design to Global Economics and Artificial Intelligence in Education.
- To enhance the atmosphere of GAP, students were encouraged to participate in the Global Ambassador scheme as well as the Model UN Conference.
- Besides the above, over 15 activities related to global awareness were organized in 2018-2019. All junior form students participated in at least 2 activities, while over 70 students took part in activities organized by external organizations.
- The Global Awareness Programme Award Scheme has been running for three years, with a total of 132 students receiving Bronze, Silver and Gold awards in appreciation of their hard work in participating in global awareness activities.
- Most of the departments and teams incorporated global awareness into their curriculums and activities.
- Global Awareness Days with the theme “Greeting and Global Village” were held from 20 – 21 Nov 2018 to arouse students’ interest in the culture of different countries.
- Field studies on Nepali food in Hong Kong (31 Jan 2019) and ethnic minorities in Tsim Sha Tsui (2 April 2019) were held to let students experience different cultures.

Reflections

- We will increase the use of other channels like, Morning assemblies, posters, campus TV promotion and school emails as ways to encourage and promote global awareness.
- We will initiate Global Ambassadors to organize activities related to global awareness for other students to participate in.

Support for Student Development

1. New S.1 Students to CFSS

Each year, a new cohort of 175 S.1 students enter CFSS. To help them adapt to the new school environment, a two-week Bridging Course (last year's being held from 5 to 16 August 2019) was held. The Course, lasting for two weeks, was composed of 2 sessions every day. The first session was academically-oriented (English Language training) to enable the new S.1 students to adapt to the secondary school curriculum. The second session was more activity-based. A creativity workshop on inventions and a creative drawing project were introduced while co-curricular trial activities related to sports, cultural, academic and social service were also organized. The Orientation Programmes for new S.1 students were held on 5 August 2019. The theme of the S.1 programme was "Adapting to New Life in Secondary School". The school social worker, as well as several YMCA members, were invited to train the peer counselors to run the function. Over 50 peer counselors joined this programme.

2. Training for student leaders

Each Student Support Team offered training to the students involved regarding their routine and ad hoc duties. The Discipline Team ran four training sessions for all prefects (27 Sept, 5 Oct, 15 Oct and 20 Nov 2018). The Head Prefect and Deputy Head Prefects joined the Outward Bound Training. Workshops for peer counsellors were organized by the Counselling Team. Student Ambassadors received training on an ad hoc basis for large-scale school functions, e.g. S.1 Information Days, Open Day. Student Council members participated in a leadership training programme.

3. Other Learning Experiences

Every CFSS student can join at least one study tour organized by the school during their six years of study, regardless of the financial background of their families. In 2018-19, the following education tours were organized.

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Besides the above, the Sex Education Team has put special effort into helping students respect each other, building a positive attitude towards sexuality and acquire an appropriate knowledge about sexual issues. Last year, the Team organized 12 classes for different levels of students. Exhibition boards by Anti-480 were set up in the Covered Playground in Feb 2019. The Discipline Team adopted different strategies to train students to abide by the school rules. 58 students received Merits of Conduct as awards for their commendable conduct.

5. Continuous support on career & life planning for our students

To strengthen students' sense of career planning and management, a total of 21 Personal & Growth Education (PGE) lessons were designed and conducted by the Career & Life Planning Team and Class teachers. Regular evaluations by teachers and students were conducted to collect their opinions and make improvements to the PGE lesson design for the next academic year.

Besides these, a total of 5 talks were conducted for parents and students to provide up-to-date information on career and life planning and further studies.

Alumni sharing, a Career Expo and a S3 Subject streaming consultation were held successfully for our students future planning. In addition, more than 30 consultation hours (both individual and group) were allocated to S.6 students for career counselling.

Students from S.1 to S.6 actively participated in various CLP-related activities organized by external organizations. A total of 2,687 participants, a record-high, were recorded this year. Among these, 1,041 of them participated in various activities about further studies.
